

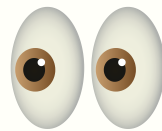

Roof Blisters 101: What to look for



As the weather changes, roof blisters can appear on your commercial flat roof. In some cases, roof blisters may not need immediate attention. If they are left untreated, they can lead to major issues such as saturated insulation and a damaged roof membrane. Roof blisters can appear in all roofing systems, but those with membranes are more prone to blistering since the blisters are formed by the gaps between the membrane and the plies or between the substrate and the membrane.

WHAT IS A ROOF BLISTER?

A roof blister signifies that water vapor is trying to escape from beneath the surface of your roof membrane. Roof blisters can be caused by a variety of issues such as:
